Q12) Write a note on linkages of EDP with RSETI, RUDSETI and DICCC?

Ans EDP are structured training initiative designed to enhance the skills, knowledge and capabilities of individuals to start and run their own businesses. EDP aim to foster entrepreneurial thinking, increase self employment and stimulate economic growth. In India, several institution plays a vital role in promoting entrepreneurship through EDP, including RUDSETI and DICCC. Following are the role on their linkages with EDP:-

1) Rural self employment training institutes (RSETI):-

These are dedicated institutes that provide free training to rural youth to help them develop skill required for self employment. These institutes are sponsored by banks and setup under the control the ministry of rural development government of India. RSETI conduct EDP focusing on practical skills training and business management, helping participants to start and sustain their own ventures.

2) Rural development and self employment training institutes (RUDSETIS):-

RUDSETIS are a joint initiative of three organizations: Syndicate Bank, Canara bank and SBI

Dharmasthala Marjunatheshwara Educational Trust.

Established in 1982, RUDSETI's aim to address unemployment issues by promoting self-employment and entrepreneurship among rural youth.

- Linkage with EDP: RUDSETI's offer comprehensive EDPs that combine skill development with entrepreneurship training. The programs include modules on personality development, business plan preparation, marketing, strategies, and financial management, aiming to empower trainees to become successful entrepreneurs.

3. District Industrial Centres (DICC's): District Industries Centre (DICs) are government-operated institutions established to promote industrial growth and development at the district level, especially focusing on micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs). They act as a one-stop-shop for entrepreneurs to access various services, including financial assistance, subsidies and technical support.

- Linkage with EDP: DICC's organize EDPs to encourage entrepreneurship among local residents by providing them with the knowledge and skills required to start their businesses. These programs schemes, subsidies, loan facilities, and other support available for entrepreneurs.
